Substance Abuse Free Environment (SAFE), Inc. is an alcohol and substance abuse prevention, intervention and education agency established in 1981 to combine the strengths of the public and private sectors in the community to provide alcohol and drug prevention services. Its board is composed of financial professionals, parents, police personnel, educators, health care professionals, and business professionals. Membership is open to residents and agency representatives of the community who support the mission and vision of the organization. SAFE's mission is to eliminate alcohol and substance abuse among youth and adults in Glen Cove through a sustainable coalition.

On Saturday, June 18, families joined together at Morgan Park for SAFE Inc. PRIDE Coalition's 4th Annual Family Awareness Day. Funded by the Glen Cove Community Development Agency and in collaboration with family and youth serving agencies, the event served as a venue to provide age appropriate alcohol and substance abuse prevention literature in a non-threatening environment that facilitates parent-child dialogue about this very important topic. This year's celebration offered parents and children a fun-filled day in the sun complete with food, games, raffle prizes, and music.

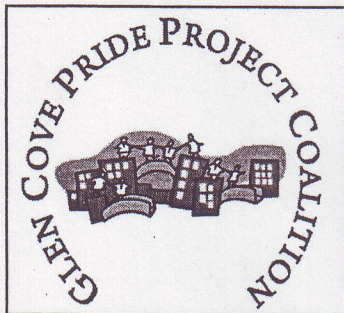

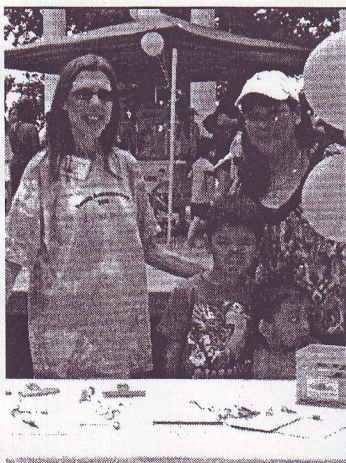


better futures by preparing them to make better choices each and every day."

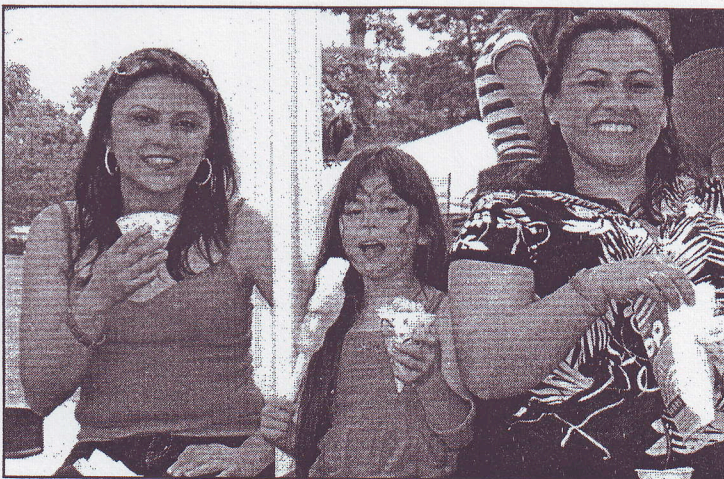

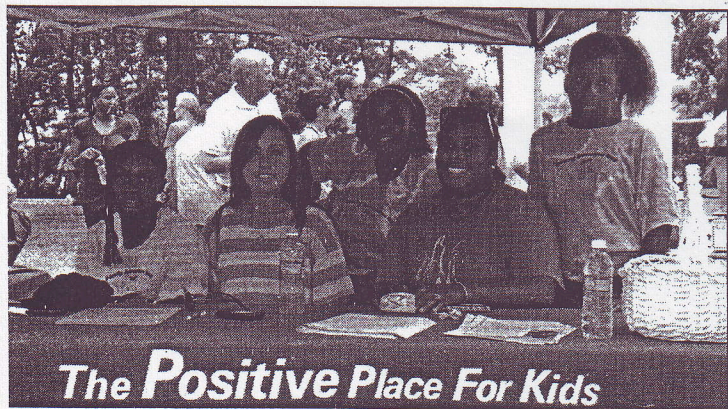
The Tobacco Action Coalition provides community members with information about the dangers of tobacco use.



Children enjoy refreshments served by volunteers.

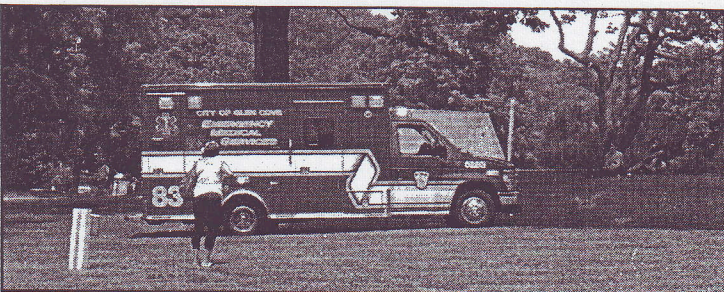


Families enjoy refreshments served by volunteers.
