

is designed to create awareness and develop strategies to prevent drug use in communities. Sponsored by the Partnership for a Drug Free America, PACT360 equips participants with extensive digital tools to identify and combat youth drug abuse. Ms. Kiernan also ran a separate workshop for the physical education faculty with regard to student fitness assessments.

Other workshops held throughout the district covered grade-level and school transitioning, report cards, end-of-theyear exams, curricular mapping and alignment, Honors and AP course preparation for students, lesson planning, and other interdisciplinary strategies focused on enhancing math, science, technology, English Language Arts, social studies, technology, music, art, home and careers, and business instruction across grade levels.

Superintendent of Schools Dr. Joseph A. Laria addressed teachers as well, reinforcing the importance of continual professional improvement and providing insight into the school district budget development process. Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Technology Dr. Shari Camhi coordinated the day's activities with building level and departmental administrators.
