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SAFE Glen Cove Coalition: Bilingual Parent Program Finds Hope During COVID

NY Project Hope is New York's COVID-19 Emotional Support Help service that provides workshops, educational materials, and trusted referrals.

Parents enrolled in Mrs. Caballero's Life Skills Training program had the privilege of hearing from Claudia Habbit of Project Hope. Ms. Habbit's presentation consisted of a variety of information that Project Hope provides in aiding individuals who are coping with COVID and its negative consequences. Parents were connected to a myriad of resources such as mental health support, substance abuse, crisis counseling therapy and helping children adjust to this time of isolation.
